




# Story is an art form.

A story covers a period of time. It has a beginning, moves through a maze of happenings and comes to a denouement.

Things to think about in preparing to tell the story of you and one of your creations:

- What was the initiation incident or inspiration that prompted your impetus to create this particular artistic expression?
- Was there a purpose or theme from the start, and/or did the idea or "feel" emerge as the creative action unfolded?
- <sup>o</sup> Was there, as in most stories, a struggle, conflict, obstacle, complexity, opportunity, coincidence, change of direction in your artistic journey?
- ° Did you have several "drafts?" Was there a sense mystery and suspense?
- <sup>o</sup> Did you experience dialogs (several voices) either inner or outer, that either helped or hindered your creative process along the way?
- <sup>o</sup> When did you know it was finished? What was your feeling when you creation was complete?





Sister Ann Willits has been a Dominican of Sinsinawa, WI for more than 60 years. She was a high school teacher and administrator, served as a member of the General Council of her Congregation and, for 21 years, was Director of PARABLE, a national Conference for Dominican Life and Mission. It was during that time that Ann became an itinerant preacher.

Ann has shared her itinerant, mendicant ministry with many of the brothers of the Central Province of St. Albert the Great, collaborating with the friars in preaching retreats, offering parish missions, giving conferences and working on research projects. Over the years she has discovered that her affection for her brothers in the Order is as profound and deep as her love and respect for her Dominican Sisters, Laity, Nuns and Associates. The Dominican Family is a model of church which was in the heart of Dominic and will be a source of renewal for all who are drawn to the Dominican charism.

In addition to writing and publishing poetry and articles, Ann has recorded three retreats for Now You Know Media; "WRITING HOME," "LANDS OF DOMINIC" and "ORDINARY MYSTERIES."

For the past 36 years Sister Ann has been an itinerant minister of the Word, traveling to many parts of the United States, and also Canada, Trinidad, South America, New Zealand, Australia, Hungary, Slovakia, Czech Republic, Spain, France and Italy.

Sister Ann received her BA from Rosary College/ Dominican University, her MA from St. Thomas University and did post graduate study at Marquette University.
